It has been about fifteen years since the Seniors last watched the Jeremias Gotthelf story of "Ueli der Knecht". That was still during the time of VHS cassettes. But on April 23rd we were able to show a digitized and restored copy of this film. The sequel, "Ueli der Paechter", is on the programme for May 28th.

Many of the Swiss classical movies are now available on DVD, i.e. they have been digitalized and some also needed restoration. "Ueli der Knecht" must have been one of the worst ones to work with. On the DVD you can read about the huge project of its restoration. The original 35 mm negative film rolls from the year 1954, which are now stored in the Swiss Film Archives, were moldy and generally in very bad condition. Scratches, tears and splices had to be repaired before the film could even safely go into a copy machine. A copy was used as the new 'original' to restore and digitalize. Then the whole 23,169 meters of film were carefully cleaned by hand to make all the mold invisible. A lot of research was done to find the best methods and cleaning products to avoid further damage. The film was photo-chemically restored, digitalized, the remaining dirty and damaged spots eliminated by software, and scratches touched up by hand. Another difficult task was to incorporate high German, French and Italian dialogues in the DVD.

Among some newer Swiss movies, some comedies and the occasional operetta, we plan on showing a few more Gotthelf films in the coming years.

Next Hike: SEA TO SKY GONDOLA TRIP: WEDNESDAY, May 17, 20017

We shall ride the gondola at Howe Sound near Squamish to 920 m elevation above sea level. the upper lift terminal allows access to a variety of attractions, for example informative trails with viewpoints, a suspension bridge, hiking trails to higher elevations, and sitting in the lodge with a restaurant or on outside picnic tables. On a clear day the views in all directions over Howe Sound are great.

The prices (inclusive 5% tax) are for a round trip on the same day and purchased on site: Adult: \$ 41.95; Senior: \$ 39.90; Youth age 13 to 18: \$ 26.20; Child age 6 to 12: \$ 14.70. Tickets may be purchased also on line with a \$ 2.00 discount at least 12 hours in advance from: www.seatoskygondola/tickets.

Ambitious hikers may climb also to the upper gondola terminal in approx. 3 hours on a trail that begins behind the gondola base and ride downhill for \$ 15.75. A reduced price for riding uphill only and walking down is not available.

We meet at 10:30 am at the ticket office of the Gondola which is at Highway 99 to Squamish, approximately 40 km from Horseshoe Bay.

The trip is only attractive in weather with good visibility. You may forget about going when rain is predicted!

Mariachi music is the sound of Mexico. It is the musical accompaniment to the important moments in life. But what exactly is mariachi? A Mariachi band is a Mexican musical group consisting of four or more musicians that wear *charro* suits.

Origins of the Word Mariachi: There are different theories as to the provenance of the word mariachi. Some say it comes from the French word mariage because it was the type of music played at weddings, other refute this theory (apparently the word was in use in

Mexico before the French intervention in Mexico in the 1860s). Others claim that it comes from the native language Coca. In this language, a term similar to the word mariachi is used to refer to the type of wood that is used to make the platform on which musicians would stand to perform.

Mariachi Instruments:

The traditional mariachi band was made up of at least two violins, a guitar, a *guitarrón* (large bass guitar) and a *vihuela* (similar to a guitar but with a rounded back).

Nowadays mariachi bands also usually include trumpets, and sometimes a harp. One or more of the musicians also sing.

The Mariachi Costume:

Since the early 1900s the charro suit, or *traje de charro* has been worn by mariachis. A charro is a Mexican cowboy from the state of Jalisco. The charro suit that mariachis wear consists of a waist-length jacket, bow tie, fitted pants, short boots and a wide-brimmed sombrero.
