We always knew that we could count on Jeanette. She inspired us all to do our best and we thoroughly miss her. This willow shall remind us of her and watch over our cabin. May it grow into a stately tree.

This is what Vreni Huser likes to share with us:

"Jeanette was my good friend. We spent a lot of time together at the Baker cabin. We all know she was an excellent manager of the cabin and liked her faucets shiny!

On our many hikes and ski trips with the group, I was always the slowest and Jeanette always insisted on staying behind with me.

Even when I told her to go ahead, she said my speed was just fine for her.

I will always remember a funny anecdote on one hiking trip when someone questioned her about her bear spray. She decided to test it out then and there, spraying away from the group, the wind blew it back in our faces and everyone instantly started coughing. She certainly would never live that one down.

But the lesson is clear: check the winds before you spray!

Jeanette was happy and cheerful. She loved to talk and loved to dance, even on her own.

Whenever I was feeling under the weather, Jeanette was very compassionate and at times phoned me every day.

She was a good friend and I will never forget her."

And here are Joe Mueller's remarks to Jeanette:

Jeanette Kuenzli has been a loyal member of the Swiss Outdoors Club for three decades.

In that period she participated in most hikes, social events, camping trips to the Kootenays and ski weeks in SunPeaks.

I have several photos attesting to her hiking skills and her enthusiasm for camping and outdoors life;

I will show them later at our next Annual Meeting.

But her most valued contributions relate to her work as Co-Manager (together with her husband Edi Kuenzli) of our recreational cabin in Glacier Springs, WH. She took great pride in ensuring a high standard in cabin maintenance and cleanliness. She didn't shy away from teaching Club members in living up to her standards. I had to learn that the hard way myself. She instructed me in her three-stage cleaning process for kitchen utensils and cutlery:

pre-wash - soak hot - and re-soak in boiling hot water.

I still benefit today from that lesson and occasionally impress my fussy sisters with my knowledge that I acquired from Jeanette.

The high standards of our Cabin have always been a source of compliments from visitors and have been an important factor in attracting visitors to our cabin. We owe Jeanette!!

On our parties at the cabin Jeanette together with Vreni Huser spoiled us often with fine Cheese Fondue dinners. In fact I have had more fondues at the cabin than anywhere else in my entire life. I credit that to Jeanette.

I will always treasure the fond memories I have of Jeanette and appreciate her contributions to our Outdoors Club. May she rest in peace.

Admission: \$ 5 for adults, \$ 3 for seniors (60+ y) and children (2-14 y). A typical tour takes about 2 hours.

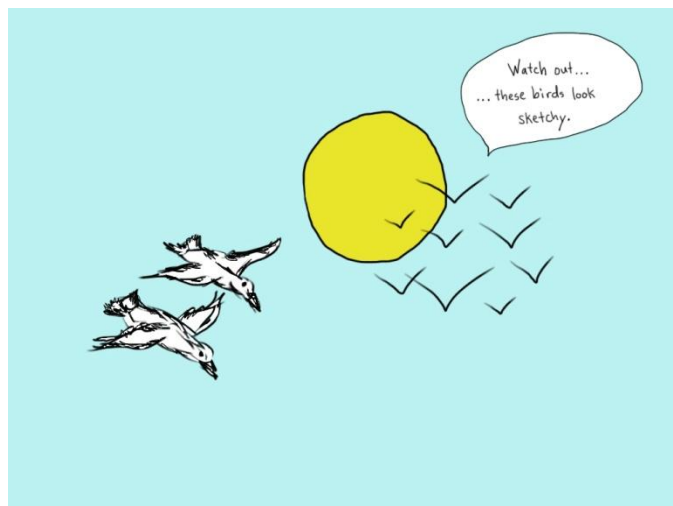
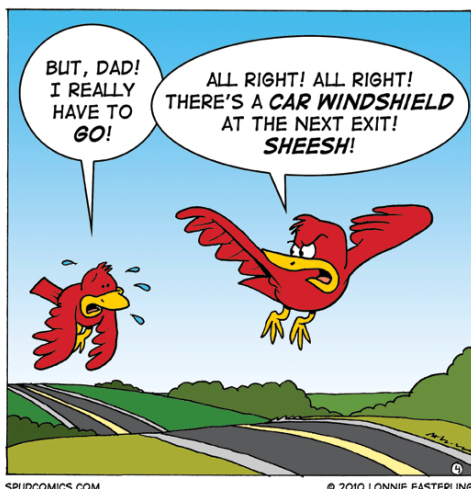

Driving Directions: The Sanctuary is 13 km west of Ladner in the Municipality of Delta. west of the intersection of Highways 10 and 17. From Ladner, follow Ladner Trunk Road (Highway 10) west to 47A Avenue and on to River Road. Follow River Road westward for 3 km and cross the bridge to Westham Island. Follow the main road to where it ends in front of large black gates. The driveway to the left leads to the Sanctuary's parking lot.

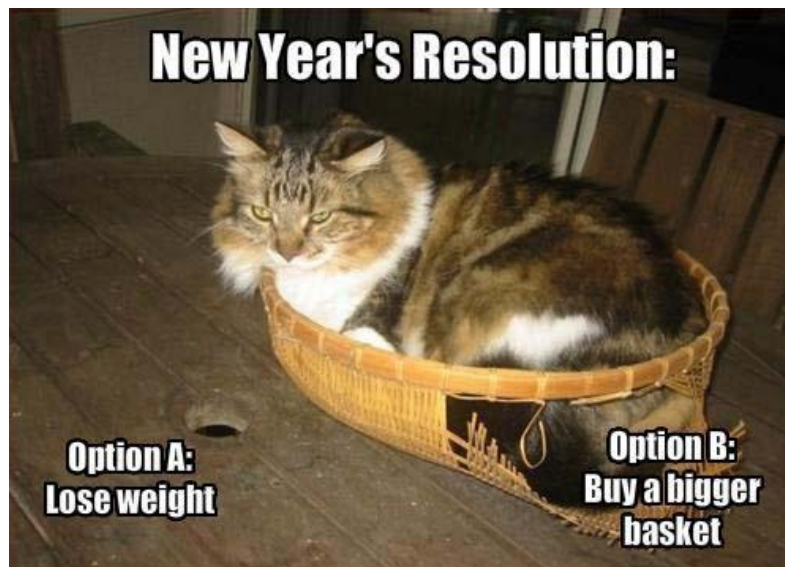
