traditions abroad. As part of the 100 year celebration of the Swiss Consulate in Western Canada, the event is partly sponsored by the Consulate General of Switzerland.


Musical Performances:

The concert was bookended by the choir's alphorn players, Kim Hong Chul and Beat Heeb. The Edmonton Swiss Men's Choir sang a set of Swiss songs with the theme of love. The choir was formed in 1980. Their passionate conductor is Elizabeth Lesoway Anderson.

Portrait of the Month

Werner Schmidt: Pastry Chef



Werner grew up in Breslau Schlesien, together with one brother and two sisters. The first Sugar-Art factory was built in Breslau.

His father was serving in the 2. World War, while his mother had to work.

The children were put into a children's home and soon enough the whole group had to flee from the Russians. By train they traveled to Dresden, where they witnessed the bombarding of the entire area. They travelled from Gerbersdorf (now Poland) to Ausig (Czech Republic), where the children were put into different families and they were separated from their brother. Later on their trip continued and they ended up in Niedersaxen, where the British were stationed. That's where their mother found them again.

Werner was introduced to Baker's Art in his early years and he was able to do an apprenticeship in Essenwerden (Ruhrgebiet). His boss and mentor was so impressed with his talent and dedication, that he recommended him to a Pastry Chef. Werner got the chance to expand his knowledge at that man's pastry shop for 3 years. Then he took the opportunity to work in Davos.

That's where he met his future wife Trudi. He continued working in Flims Waldhaus and Luzern. Trudi had her papers ready to immigrate to Canada. After 7 months he followed her to Radium Hotsprings. He eventually found work as a Pastry Chef and ended up at the Hotel Vancouver. Later he worked for different employers and even on Cruise ships to Alaska. For a while he ran his own business. He had made himself a name and was recognized by a lot of people. He worked for Safeway until his retirement. Aside from that he was teaching the art of sugar blowing, sugar pulling, marzipan modeling, cake decoration, chocolate sculptures and designer desserts in evening courses.

He and Trudi raised 3 children and are now proud grand-parents.

6 years ago (50 years after separation) the siblings were reunited with their other brother.

Werner is still passionate about his profession and he has offered to teach a baking class for Swiss Society members. He fulfills private orders by senior centres and other people who admire his talent and his edible art.

Werner says that the Swiss Chocolate is still unbeatable in flavor and texture.

The secret: **Butter**, that's made by the milk of Swiss cows, who get the most aromatic grass to eat.

Here is one of his recipes:

Streuselkuchen Ofen auf 345 F vorheizen

Teig:

425 gr Zucker

400 gr Butter

100 gr Margarine

100 gr Eier (2 grosse Eier)

900 gr Mehl

Alles mischen mit den Haenden. Die haelfte der Straeusel auf gebutterte runde Kuchenform streuen.

Fuellung:

Man nimmt Fluessigkeit von einer Buechse mit Fruechten und mixt einen Kochloeffel Maisstaerke dazu. Kochen bis saft eingedickt ist. Fuege Fruechte dazu oder nimm frische Fruechte.

Noch warm auf die Streusel giessen, mit der zweiten Haelfte der Streusel ueberdecken.

Backe fuer 50 Min. oder bis die Oberflaeche leicht gebraeunt ist.

Preheat oven to 345 F

Dough:

425 gr sugar

400 butter

100 gr margarine

2 large eggs

900 gr of flour

Mix everything with hands and put ½ of crumbles on a buttered round cake form.

Filling:

Take liquid of one can of fruit, add one table spoon of cornstarch and cook it until it thickens.

Add fruit of can or fresh fruit

Put warm filling on crumbles and cover it with other ½ of crumbles.

Bake for approximately 50 minutes or until slightly brown.
