since meeting her in 1990 at the Senior's Christmas Party at the Shaughnessy Golf Club where she was dressed in the traditional dress of her Canton. Her life after retirement was devoted to good causes but we remember Maria as a good friend and had the benefit of her sense of fun, spirit of adventure and companionship. She was a godmother to our grand-daughter, Taylor whom she adored, she told many stories to her and her sister, Isabella. One favourite was reminisces of Christmas in Switzerland and the visit by Samichlaus and Schwartz Peter. Maria enjoyed watching the girls' figure skating shows. All of us listened to her stories of ship life when she sailed to all the northern communities of BC and her achievements as a Red Cross nurse. She was of the generation of our parents and she shared stories of the past life and families of Gersau which was great fun.

Her devotion to the Swiss was undeniable but she was a proud Canadian as well. Because of Maria we participated in many Swiss concerts as well as celebrations at the chalet, Seymour mountain Christmas hikes, citizenship courts at Canada Place and walks in Vandusen Gardens where she has a May blooming tree along the Laburnum walk and another tall Dragon eye pine nearby, dedicated to Clem.

Maria lived a good life and followed her dreams.

Passing of Alois Decurtins

Hallo friends,

with regrets, I have to inform you that **Alois Decurtins (91)** passed away. He lived many decades in Burnaby and was a strong supporter of the Swiss Community.

Here a message from his daughter Cecilia Decurtins:

This to let you know that dad passed away peacefully at 14:10 on 26 June 2014.

Dad had prostate cancer for many years but it was always under control. However, just before Easter he started having back pains, which got so bad he had to be hospitalized. It turned out that this was because the cancer had metastasized into his spine and had also spread into his bladder; the cancer growth on the spine was pushing on the nerve column causing a lot of pain. We don't know how this happened so fast without anyone knowing as he had always gone regularly to be checked.

He was transferred from the hospital here in Thusis into the big Kantonal hospital in Chur (check google maps) where they did 5 directed radiation treatments on the spine at the site of the cancerous growth. He spent just over 3 weeks in the hospital, including his 91st birthday. While he was there he seemed comfortable but lacking in much energy or motivation. He did talk about how he planned to take a couple of trips to see some of his grade school buddies that are still around; he seemed like he was really looking forward to getting out of the hospital and going home.

Once he arrived home (26 May) he started to go downhill bit by bit each day. First it was his hunger, which disappeared, and then he mostly just wanted to sleep. Shortly after getting home he decided he didn't want to take the cancer medication they were giving him so that was stopped. Two weeks ago he also pretty much stopped eating so he was getting weaker by the day. Last Friday he was no longer able to get out of bed and on Wednesday they brought in a hospital bed into the apartment so it would be easier to take care of him.

He didn't want to go to the old folk's home next door so all the services came to the apartment. Like with mom, the home care he received here was truly excellent; the people who looked after him really cared and during the times I couldn't be here in Thusis with him, I knew he was in good hands. I had also signed him up for something called Seniors helping Seniors so there were two ladies, who he knew, that came in numerous times throughout the day and evening just to sit and visit with him in addition to making sure Honda (the cat) had food water and a clean kitty litter. One of the ladies stayed with him Wednesday night so he wouldn't be alone. They were with him when he passed and they said that he went very peacefully. Marcus and I were notified of his condition Thursday morning and tried to get here before he was gone but neither of us made it time.

During the time I was with him after he came out of the hospital I saw one major change. He was no longer grouchy and was happy when anyone came to visit plus you could see he really appreciated the care he was getting. He also said that he had had enough and was waiting to be able to join mom.

Marcus and I were relieved that he did not suffer for a long period of time since we knew the cancer would continue to grow and that he would have to suffer through the pain. Today we will give instructions to have him cremated. He will be put in the same "niche" as mom on Saturday, 5 July at 11:00.

Thank you for all the warm and kind thoughts throughout his illness.



Cabin Clean-Up on June 14th, 2014

On a drizzly Saturday, June 14, 2014, thirteen volunteers of the Swiss Outdoors Club met at our Cabin in Glacier Springs, WA, to thoroughly wash, vacuum and dust the interior of the cabin, to power wash the roof, to mow the lawn, to prune the surrounding bushes, and to burn the waste wood. By evening the job was done. We rewarded ourselves with a tasty dinner (Bratwuerste, Kalbswuerste, Salads and Nussgipfel as desert). We invited three neighbours for dinner and had the pleasure of getting to know them better.

The attached pictures tell the story.

Three point need to be made:

1. Our volunteers are remarkable!!

We must thank them for their dedication and efforts over all these years. Out of the 13 volunteers, five (5) were in their 80ies; four (4) were in their 70ies; the youngest was 32 years of age. Many of them have been volunteering at this cabin over the past 30 years! Where are the strong volunteers of middle age who will relieve our aged crew and eventually inherit our cabin?

2. Cleaning the roof.

Cleaning roofs is a dangerous job. Our building is three stories high and can only be accessed by a long ladder. Guess what! Our *oldest* volunteer (85) cleaned the roof and has been doing this over the last thirty years! Who will volunteer to eventually replace him?





3. The art of burning wet wood.
The clean-up of our property on a wet June day always produces a heap of moist branches, old wood and lots of brambles. Burning such waste requires skills. Fortunately some of our volunteers are well trained in wilderness survival and know how to kindle a fire under wet conditions. This makes waste disposal easy.





Well, our cabin is again in prime shape. We look forward to the visits of our many friends in the Swiss Society, the Tyrolean Ski & Mountain Club, the Pathfinders and our Swiss Community at large.



Skyline I is a good, sturdy full day hike for most hikers. It encompasses a variety of terrains and environmental

zones, and on a clear day it offers stunning panoramas. The trail is often done as a loop with cars left at both ends, but the additional 3.8 km between the two trailheads can be readily walked, either along the road or along the north section of the Gibson Loop Trail. Bring your own water on this hike as there is no water between the burn and the descent to Lightning Lake, 8-9 km away.

- Although this trail description covered the start from Strawberry Flats, it is as enjoyable (and preferred by many) to start from Spruce Bay parking lot. The initial elevation gain is more strenuous but the views offered by this route are exceptional and well worth the effort.
- -There will be an alternate hike around Lightning Lake Loop of 2-3 hrs. if there are enough people interested. Please let me know your preference, thanks. Hans-Peter Hauser



Jacques moved them into the Swiss Society's storage locker where they are safe and sound. He handed the first book out to me. It includes all the issues from March 1953 until July 5 1961.

The top picture is a scanning from the very first "Organ of the Swiss Society, Vancouver BC".

The format of the original Newspaper is 17 x 25 cm with very small letters.

What an activity calendar! The dances were one of the main income.

From now on I will include in every Swiss Herald some quotes from the old Heralds.

The Swiss currency. On March 20th 1953 it took 23.09 Canadian Cents to buy one Swiss Franc or 4.33 Swiss Francs to buy one Canadian Dollar.

I wish it still was that way! I'd go back to Switzerland at least twice a year! I hope you will enjoy these nostalgic copies as much as I do.
