





## A FEW TRIVIA FUN FACTS ABOUT B.C.

- The world's largest hockey stick resides in Duncan, and measures 205 feet long and 61,000 pounds. The mammoth symbol of hockey was created for Expo 86 and acquired by the city of Duncan afterwards.
- There is an annual flower count in Victoria at the tail end of winter. More than one billion blooms are counted by the community every year.
- The largest tin soldier in the world is located in New Westminster.
- In North America, Vancouver is second only to Los Angeles in TV production and third in feature film production. So in case you are wondering, yes; that was a famous Vancouver landmark you saw on your favourite TV show.
- Nanaimo is the Bathtub Racing capital of the world.
- The Sam Kee building located at 8 West Pender St. in Vancouver is considered by Ripley's and the Guinness Book of Records to be the narrowest commercial building in the world.
- British Columbia is four times the size of Great Britain.
- The Kits Pool in Kitsilano is the longest pool in Canada at 137 metres (or 150 yards) long.
- There are only 30 countries larger than B.C. (and one state: Alaska).
- The "Hanging Garden Tree" on Meares Island near Tofino is one of the world's oldest known western red cedars, estimated to be anywhere between 1,500 to 2,000 years old.
- B.C. resident Jim Pattison is the third richest person in Canada (and the 177th richest person in the entire world) with a net worth of 7.5 billion dollars.
- The world record for "Longest Beard" for a living male is held by Surrey resident Sarwan Singh, whose beard measures an astonishing 2.33 metres (or 7.75 feet).
- The Weather Network named Prince Rupert the wettest city in the country, with an average of 239.7 days of rain a year, amounting to a whopping 2593.6 mm of rain a year.

# **50 YEARS AGO: INEQUALITY:** THE MARCH FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE IN

On March 1, 1969, thousands of women loudly demanded the vote.

On that day exactly 50 years ago, 5,000 women and men stood in the square and at 3pm gave a concert of whistles.

The protestors read out a resolution in all four Swiss national languages, demanding full voting

rights at the federal and cantonal level.

Emilie Lieberherr, the head of the committee behind the "March to Bern", would eventually become a politician, winning a seat in the Senate. (Keystone)

It would take two years before a bill was finally presented to the (male) electorate and adopted by a two-thirds majority. However, it took another 20 years for women's suffrage to be implemented in all cantons.

# Driving out the winter

# The first of March marks the day when "Chalandamarz" processions in eastern Switzerland chase winter out of the villages.

In the Romansh language spoken in canton Graubünden, "Chalandamarz" means "the beginning of March". In eastern Swiss valleys, March 1 means a lot of noise in the villages. Schoolchildren and adolescents walk with bells and whips through the streets and around every water fountain. They traditionally wear red pointed caps and blue peasant blouses and sing spring songs. They are sure to be as loud as possible.

In some communities, only the boys are allowed to shout out the winter, while in others a straw man is burned. In some places the custom resembles a carnival procession. In the town of Ftan, the boys dress in costumes and chase the girls with inflated pig bladders.

After the bell procession, the Chalandamarz Ball takes place in each village, traditionally prepared by the women and girls. Young and old take part and celebrate the coming spring.
