#### **Urs Fricker**



Urs Fricker, beloved husband of Juliet Fricker, passed away on January 13th, 2025, after a long illness. A dedicated musician, traveler, and community leader, Urs was a founding member and longtime president of the Vancouver Dorfmusik, a Swiss-style brass band he helped grow from a five-member group in 1983 to a vibrant ensemble of over 20 players. Urs officially retired as president on August 1st, 2024 — Swiss National Day.

With Juliet by his side, Urs organized concerts, recruited musicians, managed finances, and hosted joyful gatherings. The couple traveled to over 70 countries, creating photo books and YouTube videos and slideshows after each trip, sharing their experiences through their dedicated YouTube channel.

Although the 40th anniversary of the Dorfmusik was marked quietly due to COVID, Urs's passion for music never wavered. He leaves behind an extensive music collection, now passed on to the band he

loved so dearly. His warmth, dedication, and creativity will be deeply missed.

He is survived by his loving wife Juliet and the many friends and musicians whose lives he touched. Laura Iwan has succeeded him as president of the Vancouver Dorfmusik, continuing the legacy Urs helped build over four decades.

## Francois Emanuel Freyvogel (From the North Shore News)



Francois Emanuel Freyvogel passed away on the morning of Wednesday, June 4, 2025, surrounded by his family. He was 88.

Born in Neuilly-sur-Seine, France, on October 13, 1936, Francois lived a richly adventurous and international life. The son of Alfred Freyvogel and Emmy Staehelin, he was raised in Basel, Switzerland, during and after the Second World War, later embarking on a career that spanned the globe from the

trading floors of New York to the grain fields of Canada, and from the ports of Marseille to the mountains of British Columbia.

A passionate fencer, equestrian, and devoted family man, Francois met the love of his life, Nina Preiswerck, at the Southlands Riding Club in Vancouver, where they both kept horses. They married in 1962 and shared more than 59 extraordinary years together, blending business, family, and a deep connection to the land. Their journey took them to Milan, Basel, New York, Toronto, and ultimately back to Vancouver in 1974, where they co-founded Freyvogel-Preiswerck Ltd., a company representing Western Canadian newspapers and publishing their own farm papers.

In 1980, Francois and Nina purchased a small farm in Ryder Lake near Chilliwack, which they named Elk Lake Farms. There, they raised Highland cattle and Norwegian Fjord horses, becoming an active part of the local farming community for nearly four decades. Francois thrived in this environment, where his love of nature and history came together with Nina's boundless energy and adaptability. They were grateful for the stewardship and friendship of their long-time caretakers, Wayne and Lynda Raymond.


Francois was predeceased by Nina in 2021. He is survived by his sons Jean-Luc and his wife Claire; Andreas and his wife Nathalie, his cherished grandchildren Sean, Sara, Matthew, and Sophie, and his beloved great-grandson Rowen, as well as his sister Mireille and his brother Alphonse (with his wife Adrianna). He will be remembered for his boundless curiosity, deep sense of history, sharp wit, and unwavering devotion to those he loved.

Still hopeful, he continued to engage with the world, following family activities, garden progress, news, and sports. Once in palliative care, he courageously endured until his chosen end. And until the very end, he was concerned with our well-being. We had the privilege to accompany him on his way and are thankful that his suffering is now over. Everytime we eat a garden potato or tomato, we will think of him and how he is still nourishing us. And we look forward to the zinnia, some are blooming already. He left us with these beautiful gifts in addition to all the memories.





# **Annual General Meeting March 30, 2025**

## **Summary**

40 members of the Swiss Society of Vancouver attended the AGM held at the Edmonds Community Centre in Burnaby. Special guest Consul Silvana Diego Renggli represented the Swiss Consulate. She welcomed everyone and praised the SSV board for all their work. She reminded everyone about the elections for the Organization of the Swiss Abroad and the two candidates running. The Swiss consulate has been sending emails to all registered with them about the new process wherein every Swiss abroad can now directly vote for their representative on the OSA.

#### Highlights:

• Financial Statements for 2024 were circulated and reviewed. The Society is in a positive position with respect to finances and has several GICS for the funds generated from the sale of the Mt. Baker cabin in 2020.

The sale of this cabin generated an audit of the society. This required the Swiss Society of Vancouver to go back as far as 2013 for taxes owing. All owed taxes have been paid. Our tax filings in the USA and Canada are completed. Any future taxes will be handled by a local accounting firm. (Side note: *The Mt. Baker Cabin new owners have renovated it and it is available on AirBnB to rent*).

- The auditors completed a review of the 2023 and 2024 financial statements as required by our bylaws. Thank you to Peter Brunold and Barbara Wirsching.
- Susanne Wilson, our membership chair, nominated Aio Haberli to be an honorary member of the SSV. The members present voted unanimously to endorse Aio's nomination.
- The budget for 2025 was presented and approved by those present. The budget forecasts spending approximately \$34,450.00 on various activities and operations for the year.
- The directors reported on the activities of the SSV.
- Susanne Wilson gave a comprehensive overview of the membership and the number of members in each category (Single, Family, Seniors, etc.)
- Christina Lips provided an update on the Swiss Herald newsletter. She was able to
  report about many events that had not happened since before Covid. She thanked the
  many folks who have sent her photos and also are involved in printing and mailing the
  Swiss Herald to all the members who don't have email or have paid for the printed copy
  (Susanne Wilson) and for it being posted on the SSV website and emailed out to
  everyone. (Aio Haberli)
- Aio Haberli reported on our social media facebook page and the website. We continue to get more "likes" and viewers and have added the calendar of events to the website.
- Karin Kapp reported on the activities of the Vancouver Swiss Choir. She thanked the SSV for the continued ongoing financial support. The choir held two concerts and sang at four additional venues including the Seniors Christmas luncheon and the Swiss Canadian Chamber of Commerce's Christmas Social.
- Lotti Frowein reported that the 2024 Seniors Christmas Luncheon was very well attended and successful. She plans to coordinate a couple of local events for seniors and other SSV members to join in this year.
- Elections all positions were filled by acclamation. See page \_\_ for the list of the SSV Executive.
- Under New Business, a motion was passed to have the executive review the current bylaws with respect to the section on the dissolution of the society, and review any potential amendments to ensure they are in accordance with the Society's Act. The executive is to report their findings at the next AGM.

After, we adjourned to enjoy coffee, tea, sandwiches and many baked treats brought in by the executive.
